

DESIGN FILE Interiors by Darren James

By knocking out a wall and utilising unused space from an adjoining room, this kitchen has been expanded to create a sleek streamlined space with a scullery hidden behind a 'floating' room divider unit which incorporates a selected range of stainless steel Miele appliances. Designed and installed by Interiors by Darren James, it's high tech heaven for the owners who love to cook.

This wall unit floats 300 mm off the floor and ceiling and incorporates black glass on the feature door and drawer fronts, which open electronically. LED light stripping above and below the feature wall unit provide discrete illumination.

The rangehood is cleverly concealed in a feature ebony macassa rangehood box backlite with LED lights

Mirror splashbacks reflect light in this tight space, making the room appear larger.



A staron solid surface benchtop has been formed with a split levels to define a casual seating and dining area. Calacutta marble has been inset into the staron.

A custom made stainless steel light rack provides functional task lighting and storage for bottles and glasses.

LED lighting is used to highlight the cabinetry including kickboards

Porters 'Grey Pepper' two pack in 100% gloss and flush pull soft close handles in brushed stainless steel.

This large sink is from Oliveri's 'Professional Series' is teamed with a water efficient KWC Inox vegetable spray.



In line with the clients' request for sophisticated kitchen finishes, Interiors by Darren James has used Ebony Maccassar natural veneer in a 'Piano' finish.



The scullery provides ample storage space for appliances and groceries - it opens onto an alfresco area, which brings in additional light.
